

Kansas Library eCard Fast Facts

Any public or school librarian can issue, look up, or renew an eCard.
Renewal required each 3 yrs.

Any resident of Kansas (id required) can be issued a card. There is no age restriction.

Credentials are a 6 digit ID with birthday for a password MMDDYYYY *No slashes or dashes.*

Databases can be accessed at kslib.info/databases. Some can be viewed without logging in.

The eCard connects you to free eBooks and audiobooks. Full instructions at kslib.info/digitalbooks

eCards are great for Kansas Military Personnel. The resources work from anywhere. Email kslc@ks.gov from your military email for assistance.

The State Library of Kansas works with public and school libraries to provide research databases and digital library books for all Kansas residents.

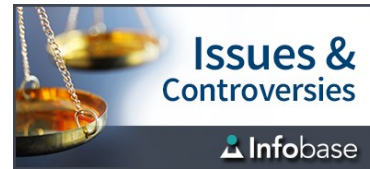
